Key Responsibilities

- Lead on fire safety and asbestos compliance, setting performance targets and delivering outcomes in collaboration with the Home Safety Manager.
- Develop and implement strategy, policies and procedures relating to fire safety and asbestos management.
- Provide expert technical advice on legislation and best practice, including The Fire Safety Act, HSG264, and Duty to Manage.
- Oversee the planning, procurement, delivery and monitoring of safety compliance programmes and related projects.
- Collaborate with internal teams and customers to co-design and deliver safety works that reflect tenant input and achieve agreed outcomes.
- Manage specialist consultants and contractors, ensuring work is delivered to specification, budget, and deadlines.
- Provide support to wider safety disciplines, including gas, electrical, lift servicing and water hygiene, working with other Home Safety team members.
- Prepare project briefs, feasibility studies, tenders, specifications, and budgets for safety improvement works.
- Monitor compliance through robust record-keeping, performance reporting and action plans for underperformance.
- Participate in the on-call rota, responding to out-of-hours emergencies (e.g., fires, floods) and acting as the organisation's representative on-site.
- Continuously review sector trends and emerging risks, sharing findings and recommendations across the organisation to promote sector-leading practice.
