Red Kite connects with Maidenhead tenants for annual Community Morning

Red Kite Community Housing has put tenant conversations at the heart of its annual Community Morning, with staff visiting homes in Maidenhead as part of their Little Door Knock.

The event, held on Tuesday 21st July, gave tenants a chance to speak directly with the housing association and share what matters most to them.

The Little Door Knock was a key focus of this year's Community Morning and marked an important step in Red Kite's ongoing commitment to being visible, approachable and connected to the communities it serves. The organisation is now planning a full-scale 'Big Door Knock' in September, aiming to call at the homes of all its tenants in Maidenhead and the other areas it serves.

As part of the Little Door Knock, tenants also received a special edition of *Red Kite Connect*, a new printed tenant newsletter.

Red Kite staff also joined colleagues from their contractors and tenant volunteers to support a range of community activities with organisations including Holyport FC, One Can Trust, Social Link, and the Lady Ryder Memorial Garden.

Peter Cogan, Group Chief Executive, who joined the organisation in April and took part in his first Community Morning, said:

"This was a fantastic opportunity to see first-hand the difference our staff can make when we come together for our communities. Taking part in the Little Door Knock gave me a real insight into the strength of our connection with tenants and the importance of listening, engaging and being visible in our neighbourhoods.

"What stood out most was the energy and care shown by everyone involved. Whether colleagues were visiting tenants, supporting local charities, helping in community spaces or lending a hand to good causes, the day was a powerful reminder of what Red Kite is all about, working together to make a positive and lasting difference."

Community Morning continues to be a much-loved annual event at Red Kite, taking colleagues away from their desks and into the community to listen to tenants, support local causes, strengthen partnerships and reflect the organisation's values of partnership, respect and pride.
