Red Kite Community Housing staff have been treated to an array of mouth-watering goodies that have been on sale to raise funds for Macmillan Cancer Support.

The High Wycombe-based housing association launched their coffee morning last Wednesday (8th October) with cakes, cookies and even sausage rolls all baked or donated by colleagues. Everything remained on sale for the rest of the week and has raised over £1000.

Daniel Haynes, IT Service Delivery Manager, organised the event after receiving help from the charity in 2021 while he was being treated for tonsil cancer.

Daniel said: “I was diagnosed with tonsil cancer in 2021, which resulted in radiotherapy and chemotherapy every day for six weeks - the treatment was physically and mentally exhausting. It was an awful time to be diagnosed with cancer during the Covid pandemic, because any stays in hospital were alone with only one person allowed to visit for an hour a day. Macmillan was always there and continue to support me four years later with specialised physiotherapy to my neck. It’s really nice to be able to give back to them after all the help and support I was given while I was unwell and going through the intense treatment.”
