Red Kite, Buckinghamshire Council and Be Healthy Bucks team up to promote Smokefree Parks initiative

Red Kite Community Housing and Be Healthy Bucks joined Buckinghamshire Councillor Julia Wassell and 'Simon The Cigarette' at Hillary Road Park in Totteridge, High Wycombe, on Monday 14th July to help promote Buckinghamshire Council's Smokefree Parks and Playgrounds initiative to local school students and their families.

The team handed out leaflets and promotional materials with no smoking messages to pupils from Highcrest Academy on their way home after school. Stop smoking mascot Simon The Cigarette was also on hand to pose for selfies and encourage them to carry the message back to their schoolmates and parents.

Hillary Road Park and recreation area is one of 11 outdoor areas across High Wycombe managed by Red Kite that have been designated as Smokefree Parks and Playgrounds. Signage at the park encouraging park users not to smoke or vape was designed by local schoolchildren. Evidence shows that children are less likely to start smoking if their primary role models, particularly their parents, do not smoke.

Cllr Julia Wassell, who represents the Totteridge & Bowerdean ward, came along to lend a hand - afterwards she commented:

"It was an excellent event which I enjoyed and the engagement was positive."
